

- involving the Children in initiatives that drive their focus away from the pandemic and ensure that they maintain a positive outlook towards life.




THE INITIATIVES RUN BY FHI DURING THE PANDEMIC

- FHI Kalakaar A nationwide contest, allowing children from our partner schools to showcase their talent.













































